



KK '16 Cabin Devo: Sunday/Wednesday night
"Jesus the Eternal Powerful One"
Revelation 1:8



Main Point to Teach: Kids must understand that Jesus whom we serve is not someone who simply lived and died, but Almighty God in the flesh who has always existed and will always exist.

Quick Start:

- Grab the attention of the kids in the cabin.
- Talk of the message tonight.
- Ask the kids what was their favorite part of the message and allow one or two of them to share. If they seem to be shy about it you share first.
- After they have shared ask them what Bro. Ryan said they should learn. Allow one or two to share. If any of their ideas seem way off, you set them back on track.

Briefly and quickly get the point across:

Short Point: The Word of God tells us the great truth of Jesus. The Lord Jesus, God in the flesh, was the creator in the beginning of the universe. "The Good Shepherd"

John 10:11



Main Point to Teach: Teach the children that Jesus the Good Shepherd gave His life for us, instructs us, and knows us personally.

Quick Start:

- Grab the attention of the kids in the cabin.
- Talk of the message tonight.
- Ask the kids what was their favorite part of the message and allow one or two of them to share. If they seem to be shy about it you share first.
- After they have shared ask them what Bro. Ryan said they should learn. Allow one or two to share. If any of their ideas seem way off you set them back on track.

Bible References

11 "8 All who ever came before Me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not hear them. 9 I am the door. If anyone enters by Me, he will be saved, and will go in and out and find pasture. 10 The thief does not come except to steal, and to kill, and to destroy. I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly. 11 I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd gives His life for the sheep."

John 10:11

Briefly and quickly get the point across:

Short Point: Jesus is the Good Shepherd. We are the sheep. If we believe and enter through Him He will save us and promises to guide us to pastures. He promises an abundant life to His sheep. He is the Good Shepherd who was willing to give His life for us. He is the Good Shepherd who guides us where we need to go. He is the Good Shepherd that knows who each and every one of His sheep are.

Bring It Home: Jesus is the good Shepherd who want to give us salvation, guidance, and a close relationship with Him. The challenge is will we hear His voice when He calls? Will we follow Him?

"The Lamb of God"

John 1:29



Main Point to Teach: The children will learn that Jesus gave His life for them as the sacrifice that pays for their sin.

Quick Start:

- Grab the attention of the kids in the cabin.
- Talk of the message tonight.
- Ask the kids what was their favorite part of the message and allow one or two of them to share. If they seem to be shy about it you share first.
- After they have shared ask them what Bro. Ryan said they should learn. Allow one or two to share. If any of their ideas seem way off you set them back on track.

Bible References

29 "The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!"

16 For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. 17 For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved.

18 "He who believes in Him is not condemned; but he who does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God.

John 3:16-18

Briefly and quickly get the point across:

Short Point: Jesus is the Lamb of God. From the Adam all the way to you and me we have fallen short of keeping all that God has commanded. We have sinned in disobedience to God and therefore we must be punished. That was not the desire of God for His creation. For this reason, Jesus came and sacrificed His life as the perfect Lamb of God to pay and take away the sins of the world.

Bring It Home: The payment for our sin has been made through Jesus Christ the Lamb of God. The bible teaches that the gift of God is eternal life in Jesus (Rom. 6:23b). But God allows each of us to make a choice about it. We can believe in Christ as the Lamb of God who takes away our sin, or we can reject the sacrifice God has made for us in unbelief. What will you do?



KK '16 Game Devo: Monday/Thursday

"The Living Water"

John 4:1-30



Main Point to Teach: The children will learn that Jesus is the only one who offers what will satisfy our thirst for salvation and purpose in life.

Quick Start: What is your favorite thing to drink in the middle of this hot dry summer? Who likes to have an ice cold Mountain Dew or Dr. Pepper? Maybe some of you prefer something healthier like a nice cold bottle of water. Some of you it may be a Gatorade. After running out in the sun having fun one way or another we get thirsty. Sometimes one drink is enough sometimes we go through many at a time trying to satisfy our thirst. Our lesson today will teach us how to fulfill our thirst.

Narrate to them the story of the woman at the well:

- **Short Story:** Jesus purposefully went through the city of Samaria. There he encountered a woman at a well. Although unusual and not customary He asked her for a drink of water. The woman could not believe Jesus would talk to her since she was a Samaritan woman. Then, Jesus proceeded to unfold His purpose. He offered her the gift of God, living (flowing) water. She did not understand Jesus at first since she was thinking of actual water and Jesus had no water pot to give any water away. But Jesus offered her something she could not deny, living water that would take care of her thirst permanently. She wanted the water, but Jesus then uncovered some of her past which led her to understand He was from God. She continued her conversation and Jesus led her to the living water. The woman came to understand that Jesus was the Anointed one the Savior of the world. The woman drank the living water and shared it with the Samaritans as she spoke of Jesus when she ran back to Samaria.
- **Short Story Focus:** There are many things people trust (wells) for salvation but only Jesus has the living water. There are many things that people trust for purpose and fulfillment in life (wells) but only Jesus can truly satisfy that thirst.

Bring It Home: Only Jesus can satisfy the thirst of life for salvation and for purpose and fulfillment. Are you drinking from the living water or from the well?



KK '16 Game Devo: Tuesday/Friday

"The Seeker"

Luke 19:1-10



Main Point to Teach: The children will learn that Jesus did not come to find perfect people but to seek lost sinners who need a Savior and friend.

Quick Start: If you were the captain of a team and have to pick players to be on your team, who would you pick? Your friends? The best players? Who would you pick last? Those who are not your friends or those who you think are not that good? You see when we play a game we seek those whom we like and are the best. When God seeks for someone to save who does He look for? Does He only pick the ones He likes or those who are the best? Listen to today's story and we will learn who Jesus is seeking to save and be their friend.

Narrate to them the story of Zacchaeus:

- **Short Story:** Zacchaeus was a short chief tax collector that lived in Jericho. The fact that he worked for the Roman government collecting and cheating tax money from people made him a hated man. But one day Jesus walked through Jericho and everyone including Zacchaeus wanted to get a glimpse of the miracle working teacher. To the surprise of Zacchaeus and all the people Jesus called Zacchaeus down by name from the tree he had climbed. The people did not understand why Jesus would go to the house of such a sinner. In the eyes of Jesus, He had found that which was lost. Zacchaeus reacted to the love and goodness Jesus showed him and began to turn things around in his life.
- **Short Story Focus:** People can make the mistake to think that Jesus only wants perfect people. The truth is that Jesus still seeks those who are lost in sin and disobedience that He may save them.

Bring It Home: Jesus seeks sinners like you and me that He may save us and to be our friend.



KK '16 DQT Devo: Monday/Thursday

"Jesus Said"

Luke 5:1-11; Mark 1:16-20



Main Point to Teach: The children will learn that when we follow Jesus He not only begins to work in our life but promises that He will complete His purpose for us.

Helping Passages: Matthew 4:18-22; Philippians 1:6

Quick Start:

Narrate the story in: Luke 5:1-11. **Read all of Luke 5 for your own benefit.**

(Just a reminder teach it at a the level of the children you are teaching)

Make sure to point out as you tell the story:

- **Story Introduction:** Jesus had begun His ministry on earth. He began to teach and preach of the work of salvation He had come to do and the truths of the kingdom of heaven which had arrived. Many would come to listen to the teachings of the new teacher. Many would understand and believe while others would reject His teachings and claims.
- **Lead role:** Jesus is the main character of this event. Jesus continued His ministry by teaching the people. He had gotten acquainted with two sets of brothers who were fishermen. In this instance they were by the lake of Gennesaret (sea of Galilee) washing their nets from a long night of fishing. It was at this moment that Jesus solidified who He was when He commanded them to go cast their nets at an unusual hour for fishing. The customary and more successful time to fish was at night. But they listened to His instruction and were in awe of the result.
- **Supporting Cast:** Peter, Andrew, James, and John the fishermen. These men had heard Jesus teach and preach. They had accepted His message. After a long night of unsuccessful fishing Jesus gave them an irrational command. Jesus wanted them to cast their nets and although they did not think their attempt would succeed they obeyed. To their amazement it did not take but a single cast before the nets were full with more than they could hold. They all stoop in amazement of Jesus and what had occurred at His command.
- **Climax of the Story:** The boats brought in an extremely heavy load of fish. But the occurrence was not normal and it caused them all to react to Jesus. Peter fell before Jesus in fear for he knew that he was a sinner. Peter did not feel worthy to be in the presence of the Master. But then Jesus made an invitation and gave them a guarantee. He called them out to follow Him and He would make them fishers of men. Jesus did not only call them out to a purpose but promised them that He would complete it in them.
- **Conclusion:** The men responded to Jesus. They immediately left their nets and boats to follow Jesus. Jesus had began to write the story of their lives as His followers. Jesus would go on to keep His promise to them. These men became preachers of the good news of Jesus which went around the world.

Bring It Home: Many times we are intimidated with thinking that God has a plan in our lives. We trust Jesus to be our Savior, but to think that He could do something in our lives seems harder to imagine. We are like Peter we think that our sin is too great for Him to be able to be with us. We learn from this story that Jesus not only want to save us but He also want to finish what He has began in us. The invitation is open for us to follow after Jesus and He will make us become the boys and girls that will fulfill His great propose for our lives. Will you let Jesus complete His purpose? Will you follow?



KK '16 DQT Devo: Tuesday/Friday

"Jesus Does Care"

Mark 4:35-41



Main Point to Teach: The children will learn that no matter what problem or situation arises Jesus is with us to help always.

Helping Passages: Matt. 8:23–27; Luke 8:22–25

Quick Start: Have you ever doubted if God was with you? Maybe it has been a difficult situation at home or school that made you wonder if God is with you. There are sometimes in life where God seems like He is not there or not listening to us. But what do you think the truth is? Has God really left us alone? Listen today as we find that the disciples that followed Jesus everywhere had a time like this as well.

Narrate the story in: Mark 4:35-41. **Read all of Mark 4 for your own benefit.**

(Just a reminder: Teach at the level of the children you are teaching)

Make sure to point out as you tell the story:

- **Story Introduction:** Jesus had spent time teaching the people through illustrations. He had taught them many truths about the kingdom of God. After all of this He had commanded His disciples to get on a boat and cross the Lake of Gennesaret (Sea of Galilee). It was there the disciples would learn one more lesson.
- **Lead role:** Jesus is the main character of this event. Jesus had been teaching the multitudes and now commanded the disciples to go across the Lake of Gennesaret. He went into the boat with them, but quickly found a place to go to sleep. Jesus was able to sleep even through what the disciples would have described as a horrible storm.
- **Supporting Cast:** The disciples. The disciples had obeyed the instructions of Jesus and loaded on a boat to cross the lake. They took care of the navigating while Jesus slept. But an unexpected, but very usual storm began to take place. As the storm picked up their worry grew. The boat began to be swayed harder and harder. Eventually they had all they could handle when the boat began to take water. They thought that their doom was certain.
- **Climax of the Story:** It was at this time in the event that they went to Jesus who was still asleep. They woke Him in great worry and asked for His help. Their question, do you not care? They were convinced that they would not survive. How could Jesus just sleep? This did not even stir Jesus. He simply arose to command the wind and the sea to be still.
- **Conclusion:** Immediately the wind ceased and the sea was calmed. Jesus then asked a tough question to them, why were you afraid? They had forgotten who was in the boat with them. Could they not believe that even asleep Jesus was aware of the situation? They stood in amazement of what had just happened. They had never seen such great occurrence in their lives. They understood just a little bit more that Jesus was more than just a teacher. He cared for them and even the wind and the sea obeyed Him.

Bring It Home: There are many times in life that it seems that Jesus, God, may not care or be paying any attention. It may be you have a problem at home with your parents, maybe somebody is sick in your family, perhaps your trouble is with friends. It may seem that you will indeed not make it through it. But have no

fear because no matter what situation you are in you can be sure Jesus is there with you. You have to trust Him to calm the trouble in your life or to get you through it. How do we know that Jesus cares and is on our side? He proved it when He took care of our greatest problem, sin. **Present plan of salvation (or flipper flapper)**. No matter if it is a difficult situation in life or the problem of sin Jesus cares and is with us to help. Before Jesus went on to heaven after rising from the dead He said "Lo, I am with you always" (Matt. 28:20).
